The song "When Time Stood Still" presents an interesting case for analyzing implicature, as its lyrics contain indirect meanings that contribute to the song's overall message and emotional impact. By examining how implicature functions in the lyrics, this study aims to uncover the underlying messages and the ways in which listeners interpret them.

This research applies Grice's Cooperative Principle and its maxims—Quantity, Quality, Relation, and Manner—to analyze the song's lyrics. The study seeks to answer the following questions: (1) What types of implicature are present in "When Time Stood Still"? (2) How do these implicatures



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contribute to the meaning of the song? The findings will contribute to a broader understanding of linguistic pragmatics in music and highlight the role of implicature in artistic communication. Research Methodology

1. Research Design

This study employs a qualitative descriptive approach to analyze the implicatures in the song "When Time Stood Still". The research focuses on interpreting the implied meanings within the lyrics rather than numerical data, making qualitative analysis the most suitable method.

2. Data Collection

The primary data source for this study is the official lyrics of "When Time Stood Still". The lyrics will be examined for instances of implicature based on linguistic and contextual clues. Additional data may be gathered from artist interviews, listener interpretations, and critical reviews to provide contextual support for the analysis.

3. Data Analysis

The analysis follows Grice's Theory of Implicature, particularly his Cooperative Principle and its four maxims (Quantity, Quality, Relation, and Manner). The research will identify: Conversational Implicatures, where meaning is inferred based on context and the violation of Gricean maxims.

Conventional Implicatures, where meaning is implied regardless of context.

Each line or phrase containing potential implicature will be analyzed in terms of its linguistic structure, intended meaning, and contextual relevance. The study will also consider how implicature contributes to the song's emotional and poetic impact.

4. Validity and Reliability

To ensure the credibility of the findings, cross-referencing will be conducted with expert interpretations, listener feedback, and relevant literature on implicature in music. Peer review and discussions with linguistic experts will further validate the analysis.

Findings and Discussion

Findings

This study analyzed the song "When Time Stood Still" to identify various forms of implicature based on Grice's Cooperative Principle. The key findings include:

- 1. Conversational Implicatures The lyrics often flout Grice's maxims (quantity, quality, relation, and manner), creating implied meanings beyond the literal text. For example, instances where the singer provides less information than expected (flouting quantity) require listeners to infer deeper meanings related to nostalgia, love, or loss.
- 2. Conventional Implicatures Certain phrases and expressions inherently carry implied meanings. Words related to time, stillness, and memory suggest themes of longing and reflection, even without explicit statements.
- 3. Contextual Dependence The interpretation of implicature is influenced by the listener's personal experiences and cultural background. Some lines may suggest a romantic connection, while others might imply a metaphorical pause in life due to significant events.



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4. Emotional and Poetic Impact - The song's use of implicature enhances its emotional depth, making it more engaging for listeners. By leaving certain meanings unsaid, the lyrics invite interpretation, fostering a deeper connection between the song and its audience.

Discussion

The findings align with pragmatic theories on implicature, particularly Grice's maxims. The song demonstrates how artists strategically use implicature to evoke emotions and convey messages without direct statements. The frequent use of metaphorical language and ambiguous phrasing adds layers of meaning, making the song open to multiple interpretations.

Furthermore, implicature in song lyrics functions differently from everyday conversation. While Grice's maxims suggest that speakers should be cooperative and clear, artistic language often deliberately breaks these rules to create poetic effects. This study highlights how implicature contributes to the richness of song lyrics, emphasizing the importance of context, listener interpretation, and cultural knowledge in understanding implied meanings.
